Clinic Activities

in collaboration with VCOM and UNITEC University, Baxter Clinic had the privilege of providing healthcare to 1791 patients from all parts of Honduras.

This accomplishment would not have been possible without the combined efforts of our dedicated medical staff, UNITEC, and VCOM. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all those involved in making this collaboration a resounding success.



In May and June, Baxter Clinic, OCU, and VCOM students contributed their invaluable expertise to two medical brigades, resulting in over 400 patients from Divina Providencia, Guajire, and Cerro Bueno receiving vital medical attention.

By actively participating in these brigades, VCOM students have demonstrated their compassion and willingness to go above and beyond to provide quality care to patients who may otherwise lack access to essential medical services. Baxter Clinic is immensely grateful for the invaluable contribution of the VCOM students, OCU, and their role in making a positive difference in the health and well-being of these communities.





New Cytology Program!

The Cervical Cytology Program started in April 2023, to date 92 women have benefited. The average age of the women attended was 42 years, where 60% had 3 or more pregnancies.

Epithelial cell abnormalities were identified in 11% of patients and referred to a higher level of care for colposcopy to rule out cervical cancer.

60% of the patients required some type of management in this Assistance Centre, most commonly due to vaginal infections or atrophy of the vaginal mucosa.

FINAL MANAGEMENT OF THE PATIENT

30% of the patients received treatment for a vaginal infection. Patients received a combination of vaginal suppositories or vaginal cream plus oral medication: Fluconazole 150mg or Metronidazole/Tinidazole.

- Price per treatment: 255 L (\$10.32) x 30% (28 patients): 7,140 L (\$288.85)
- Price per cytology reading: 90-180 L (3.64 - 7.28 \$)

30% of the patients received management for vaginal atrophy with medications not available in the clinic such as: lubricants, topical estrogens, soy isoflavones. To include them in the basic scheme of the clinic would be beneficial for the patients, but would significantly increase the price unit for each patient.

Nutritional Program

The Nutritional Program remains committed to supporting impoverished single mothers by continuing their food bag donations. The sewing and beauty classes also continue to thrive, providing valuable skills and opportunities for personal and financial growth.

The Nutritional Program recently brought joy and practical assistance to the children enrolled in the program by providing them with backpacks. What makes these backpacks even more special is that they were designed and sewn by the mothers who are part of the Nutritional Program. The personalized touch of having backpacks crafted by their own mothers adds an extra layer of warmth and care to the children's experience. The Nutritional Program is proud to support and empower these remarkable mothers, recognizing their invaluable contributions and the positive impact they have on their children's lives.



The Mothers of the Nutritional Program were fortunate to receive a valuable nutritional talk facilitated by Unitec University. This enlightening session provided them with essential knowledge and practical guidance regarding proper nutrition and its impact on their health and the well-being of their families.



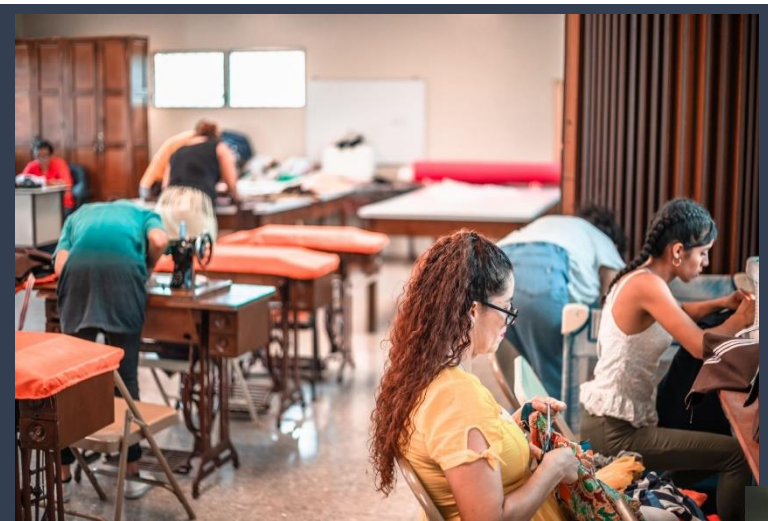

From April to June the budget to provide for 46 families participating in the Nutritional Program with food bags and medical care was of US\$ 5407.67. There was a total of 408 food bags delivered, the food bags normally contain sugar, rice, beans, oil, milk, spaghettis, oatmeal, cornmeal, and provide a wide supplementation for each family.

Baxter Clinic is immensely grateful for VCOM's commitment to improving the lives of children and its dedication to creating a nurturing environment within the clinic.



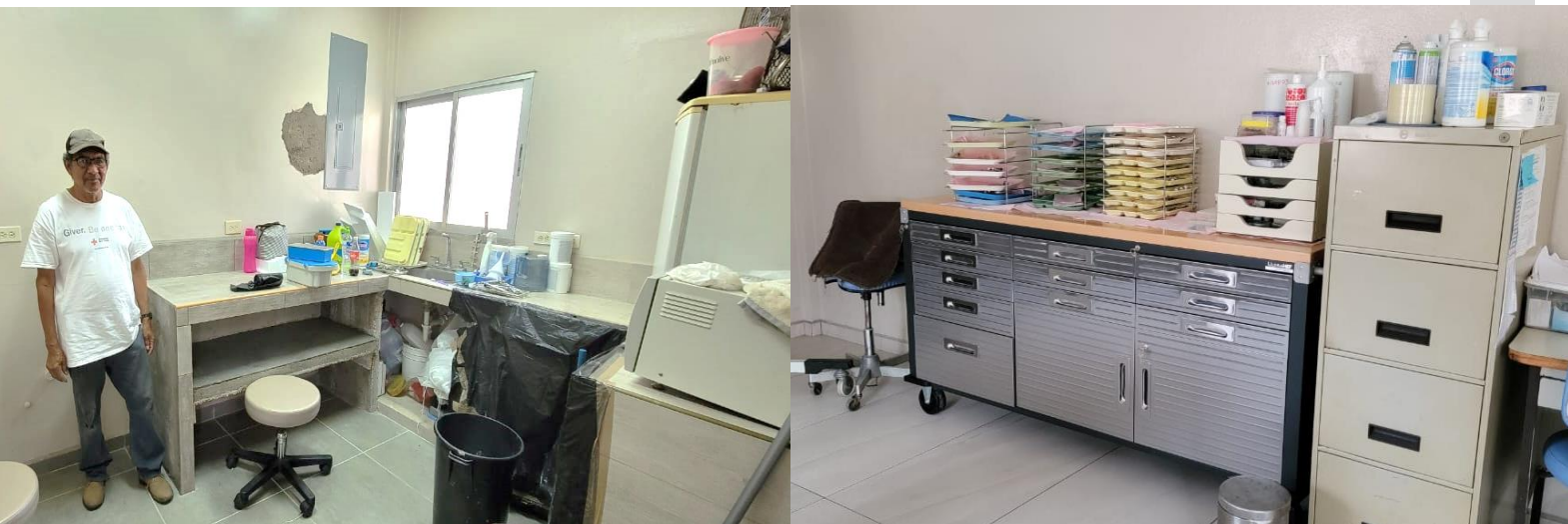
Dental Clinic

The pharmacy at Baxter Clinic remains committed to providing free medication to underprivileged patients. By offering this service, the clinic aims to alleviate the burden of healthcare expenses and ensure that patients can receive the necessary treatment without financial barriers.

From April to June around 2,000 prescriptions were made to attend to the medical necessities of Baxter patients. The total budget to provide for all the patients was 9,513 \$.
